Bee Boxes

 8 more of these have been bought with the Biodiversity grant money. As they were on sale for half price we also bought some more for members to have a chance to buy them for £12 rather than £25. First come first served. Only 5 left. They need to go on a S or SE facing wall, not under shade or shelter. About 1.5 M above ground.

Hedgehog Highway. We gave all the families in the schools a template for a hedgehog doorway as we would really like to see Read and Simonstone residents helping to increase the local hedgehog population by having a hedgehog doorway in their fences. It would be good to emulate the success of Keyworth Village. As yet no one has been in contact re our request for sightings of hedgehogs in 2024 or 2023 or hedgehog poo. Please let us know if you have hedgehogs near you or in your garden so that we can do some Citizen Science and draw a map of whereabouts and then we know if they have increased their numbers as a result of putting 5" square holes/gaps in our fences. As they are nocturnal animals you may

not see them about. However I am reliably informed that hedgehog poo is a good sign. Its black/very dark brown, roughly sausage shaped, 1.5-2cm long, glistens and looks almost metallic, there are other signs too. Check them out on the web.

Nature Notes

The 'deer' that was spotted recently in the fields adjacent to Dawson Ave. may have been a dog!! Swifts are back around Hambledon View - hurrah. A barn owl has been seen near Simonstone School and a gold finch and reed buntings near Martholme Greenway. And isn't the morning and evening birdsong glorious?
